Offers a proven and effective way to organize, equip, and supervise a team of congregation members - called Stephen Ministers - to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community experiencing life difficulties.

Family Mentoring Team

After the Denver Rescue Mission approves homeless families, they contact the Broomfield UMC Family Mentoring team to place families in the area. The team not only helps the family with immediate household needs and social service resources, but they work with the family on financial, work, family, and personal goals.

In 2024 the team continued to work with a grandmother whose son died and is helping raise her five grandchildren. It has not been an easy road for her and she works three food delivery jobs to stay afloat. She is very appreciative of the team's moral support and a bit of financial help. Family Mentoring maintains contact with another large family and is open to taking a new family when the Rescue Mission calls.



Wheels to Worship

Provides transportation on Sunday mornings to those who would not be able to get to church on their own. Five volunteers brought eleven of our community members to in-person worship each week. Founded

Heart to Heart

The Heart to Heart Team is a group of nine caring volunteers who make visits and calls to partners and friends of Broomfield UMC who are homebound or reside in senior communities and assisted living. In 2024, Heart to Heart members reached out to 25 different senior and disabled partners and friends, offering encouragement, listening, and prayers. Heart to Heart volunteers give generously of their time to make visits, make phone calls, send cards, and drop off treats. This caring, compassionate team welcomes new members throughout the year.

Prayer Team

A team of 12+ prayer warriors who believe prayer heals, guides, soothes, and saves. They pray over requests and lift up joyful praises that come through the church by email, phone calls, or the Prayer and Care cards. Alice Potter leads the team and she welcomes new members.


Studies show that the development of social/emotional skills in the early years are vital for success in elementary and secondary education, and through the play-based curriculum that we provide, we are able to set our students up for success before they enter the larger classes of public education.

This year's focus was "Superheroes of the Bible." This curriculum focused on a positive social/emotional trait from someone in the Bible, such as being a good listener, being a good friend, or being a good helper, and integrating that person's story and their superpower into the everyday curriculum of the classroom. Parents joined the students and staff each month for Chapel and have given a lot of positive feedback on the stories and songs.




Bible Story of the Day

For Culinary Week, the campers modeled the popular British baking show The Great British Bake Off using basic baking recipes and then choosing from various extra ingredients to make one-of-a-kind baking masterpieces. These masterpieces were then judged by different members of the Broomfield UMC staff each day. The Christian focus was based on "I Can Be a Friend At All Times." Culinary week continues to be the most popular camp with a total of 24 campers attending.

The Art Campers learned about contemporary artists that taught them about beauty in their world through color, beauty in the simple things, and beauty in themselves through artists such as Seurat, Chagall, Oldenburg, Lange, and Kahlo. The Christian Theme was "Think About It." The campers were challenged to change the way they think every day, to question what they hear and see, and let God be their guide.

The Mystery Camp had campers solving riddles for escape rooms, hunting down clues to determine what activities they would be doing, and learning about the concept, "Is God Real?" Each escape the campers completed taught them the story of someone from the Bible.

Messy Camp had the campers getting muddy, soapy, wet, covered in paint and slime, and getting very messy each day. They learned that life can also be messy, and that God is there to help us when it is.

United Women in Faith (AKA: UWFaith)

United Women in Faith seeks to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship, and education so they can inspire, influence, and impact local and global communities.

- Approximately 100 members
- 5 different diverse groups meet regularly
- Continue to give their time and money to Broomfield Fish, A Precious Child, Hope House, Mirror Image Arts, and Broomfield **UMC** Youth
- In 2024, groups made: 250 feminine hygiene kits, 60 Linus blankets, 200 Easter baskets for Fish, May baskets for area shut-ins, and shoe box gifts for the senior community of Pine Ridge Reservation
- Support for families through the Family Mentoring Team, local immigrants, and The Refuge
- Offered a ministry of hospitality through 25 funeral receptions allowing grieving families a chance to share time together
- Hosted talks by representatives from The Refuge, CU Wesley Foundation, and Hope House
- Continue to participate in the UWFaith national reading program, encouraging members to learn more about where and what UWFaith can do to better the world
- Raised funds through cheese ball sales, fudge sales, and grocery store programs as well as member pledges





English as a Second Language (ESL)

Nine classes (beginner to advanced) offered each week during the school year at Broomfield UMC. The program is run by Kathy Case and taught by volunteers who work with a diverse group each year. Students from over 50 countries have come through the program at Broomfield UMC. A second language is not required to be a teacher, and anyone can help!

Creation Care Team

The Creation Care team continues to be active in seeking ways to improve our environmental sustainability practices and impact by using washable coffee cups on Sunday mornings, composting of church waste, trash pick up/beautification programs, and federal and state grant opportunities for installing more energy efficient equipment in the church's facilities. Some of these efforts have already begun while others are still in discussion and planning. Sunday mug washing volunteers are always welcome!





Equal Exchange

Equal Exchange is a Fair Trade organization that buys directly from small-scale farmer cooperatives, which are owned and run by the farmers themselves. We are now serving organic Fair Trade coffee for fellowship on Sundays, and we introduced a new display and sales cabinet, run by Rod and Myrna Prentice, in October for Equal Exchange products, allowing partners and friends to purchase organic Fair Trade coffee, tea, or chocolate bars whenever they need them, with a portion of the proceeds supporting the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR).



Facilities - Just the Facts

- Installed new signage in the Chapel/Church Office interior entrance, "Love Like Jesus....No Strings Attached" (framed in a metal welded frame made with Lew Dukes'assistance)
- Replaced: Fellowship Hall reach-in freezer compressor and a power booster on the fire alarm
- New compressors were installed for the Family Life Center AC unit
- Sanctuary stage AC unit's squirrel cage and main control board/sensor were replaced
- Frozen pipes in the 200 wing staff worked together to establish temporary classrooms for Apple Tree while the repairs were made by our facilities team
- Feedback about the tightness of the stalls in the women's Main Hall restroom led to reversing the doors, allowing them to swing open/out
- Renovated the Choir/Music Room, led by Carolyn Balmer (fresh coat of paint, new carpeting, and updated furniture)
- New auto-dispensing paper towel and new toilet paper dispensers installed throughout building
- For years we've had challenges with bats getting into the church. Volunteer Darrayl Cannon made bat houses that were installed along the roof line to give bats a better place to hang out.

2024 witnessed the fingerprints of the congregation blessing many ministries. Christmas Eve and Easter contributions contributed \$41,817 to CASA, Global Hope, 1 for 100, El Sambrador School – Ecuador, ESL, and Colorado Safe Parking Initiative.


